EXHIBIT "A"

In the name of God, Amen. I, Susannah Crowwell, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, being weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding, Considering the Certainty of death, and the uncertainty of the time thereof, and being desirous to settle my worldly affairs, and thereby be the better prepared to leave this world when it shall please God to call me hence, do therefore make and publish this, my last Will and testament, in manner and form following, that is to say:

First and principally, I commit my soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my body to the earth, to be decently buried at the discretion of my executor, hereinafter named.

After my debts and funeral charges are paid, I devise and bequeath as follows:

Item. I give and devise unto my daughter, Lucretia Amelia Crowwell, (in consideration of the care and attention I have received at her hands in my old age, as well as for the assistance I have rendered my other children in the past,) all of my estate, both personal and real; that is to say, \$-my house and lot situated in the town of Walkersville, together with all the furniture and other personal property of mine therein and thereon, to have and to hold so long as she shall live; The said premises to be the abode, also, of my son, Zachary Taylor Crowwell, so long as he shall remain unmarried.

And lastly, I do hereby constitute and appoint my son, Arthur H. Crowwell, to be sole executor of this my last will and testament, revoking and annulling all former wills by me heretofore made, ratifying and confirming this and none other, to be my last will and testament. In testimony whereof, I hereunto set my hand and seal, this 23rd day of May in the year Eighteen Hundred and eighty-five.
