To the Honorable, the Judges of said Court:

Your Orator, Christopher C. Stotelmyer, who, by his Solicitor, Frank C. Norwood, sues as well for himself as all other creditors of Georgianna Marken and James H. Marken, her husband, both late of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, deceased, who will come in and contribute to the expenses of this suit, complaining says,

1. That the said Georgianna Marken and James H. Marken, her husband, were in their lifetime indebted unto the Smithsburg Bank of Washington County, Maryland, in the sum of One hundred dollars by their promissory note bearing date January 15th. A.D. 1910, payable ninety days after date, on which note the defendant Ora C. Marken and your Orator, Christopher C. Stotelmyer appears as co-makers, although in truth and fact they were and are sureties, they not having received any of the proceeds of said note; that the said makers of said note did not pay the same at maturity, although they did pay part thereof; that being obligated to pay the balance of said note Your Orator paid the same, which, together with interest due to February 8th, instant, and protest charges, amounting to the sum of sixty-five dollars and eighteen cents (\$65.18) whereupon said Bank duly assigned said note to Your Orator, which note is filed herewith as exhibit No. 1 and, with other exhibits herewith filed, as prayed may be considered a part of this Bill!
