To the Honorable the Judges of said Court:-

The Petition of Albert W. Eoker and Allen D. Hoover, Trustees, respectfully shows unto your Honors! FIRST! That John S. Weybright and Annie E. Weybright, his wife, by their deed of trust being dated the 4th day of June A.D. 1915, and recorded in Liber H.W.B. No. 312, folio 454, one of the land records of Frederick County, conveyed to your petitioners all the property and estate of them and each of them in trust, to sell so much as is saleable and collect so much as is collectable and apply the proceeds thereof to the payment of the debts of them, said John S. Weybright and Annie E. Weybright, respectfully as in said deed of trust is provided, as will more fully appear by a copy of said deed trust filed herewith marked Exhibit No. 1 and prayed to be taken and considered as part of this petition as fully as if here inserted in words and figures.

SECOND! That your petitioners have excepted the trusts created by said deed and have filed their bond with approved security, conditioned for their faithful performance of said trusts, in the penal sum of \$35,000. being as nearly as can be ascertained double the amount of the whole trust estate.

THIRD! That a portion of the property conveyed to your trustees is a stock of goods, in a store situated in Thurmont in Frederick County conducted by said John S. Weybright, consisting of hardware, groceries, country produce, agricultural implements, &c. and which store was being conducted by said John S. Weybright at the time of the execution of said deed of trust, and your petitioners believe it would be to the interest of said trust estate and of the creditors of said John S. Weybright and Annie E. Weybright for said store to be kept open and the articles of merchandise to be sold at retail until they can have an opportunity and shall be able to sell the stock in bulk, and for your petitioners to be authorized to replenish staple and necessary articles of groceries, &c., to assist in retaining the trade of the store and in the sale of the remaining articles. And your petitioners pray for the following relief: 1st! That your Honorable Court will assume jurisdiction of said trusts created by said deed of trust and grant your petitioners the aid and protection of your Honorable Court in administering and executing said trusts.

2. That your Petitioners as Trustees may be authorized to sell said stock in trade by retail and to employ such help as may be necessary therefor, and to purchase, in small quantities from time to time, such staple articles as they may find necessary to assist in selling the remaining stock of merchandise. 3. That your Petitioners may have such other and further relief to which they may be entitled; and they will ever pray, &c.
