At the request of Albert W. Ecker and Allan D. Hoover the following Deed was received for record and Recorded June 4th, 1915, at 4 O'Clock P.M.

THIS DEED, made this fourth day of June, in the year nineteen hundred and fifteen, by us, John S. Weybright and Annie E. Weybright, his wife, of Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, WITNESSETH: Whereas, the said John S. Weybright is indebted unto sundry persons in various sums of money which he desires and intends to pay in full and the better to secure the payment of his said indebtedness has agreed to convey and assign all of his property and estate to Albert W. Ecker, and Allan D. Hoover, in trust for the benefit of his creditors as hereinafter set forth, and WHEREAS, said Annie E. Weybright also has estate of her own and has an Mortgage indebtedness thereon and is also bound as surety for said John S. Weybright in judgements and upon notes, which she also desires shall be paid in full, and to that end has agreed to unite with said John S. Weybright in conveying all of her property and estate as well as her interest in the estate of her said husband, the said John S. Weybright, to the said Albert W. Ecker, and Allan D. Hoover, in trust for the benefit of her creditors as hereinafter set forth. NOW THEREFORE, this deed witnesseth, that in consideration of the premises and the sum of five dollars, we, the said John S. Weybright and Annie E. Weybright, his wife, do hereby grant, convey and assign unto the said Albert W. Ecker and Allan D. Hoover, all the property and estate of us, the said John S. Weybright and Annie E. Weybright, in and to all that lot or parcel of land, with the improvements thereon situated in the town of Thurmont in Frederick County, Maryland, conveyed to the said John S. Weybright and Annie E. Weybright by Jesse P. Weybright and wife by deed dated the 3rd day of March A.D. 1910, and recorded in Liber H.W.B. No. 290, folio 434, one of the Land Records of Frederick County; also all that farm situated in Carroll County in the State of Maryland, conveyed to said Annie E. Weybright by John S. Weybright, Administrator with the will annexed of Daniel R. Saylor, deceased, by deed dated the 1st day of April A.D. 1903 and Recorded in Liber J.H.B. No. 97 folio 299, one of the landrecords for Carroll County; also all the stock in trade, personal property, books of account and choses in action of him the said John S. Weybright, and also all the property and estate of them the said John S. Weybright and Annie E. Weybright and each of them, of every kind and nature and description, real and personal and wheresoever situated, except as such as may be exempt from execution by law. To have and to hold the same unto the said Albert W. Ecker and Allan D. Hoover, and the survivor of them, in trust for the following purposes, to-wit: FIRST, to take possession of the said property and estate of the said John S. Weybright including the said property owned jointly by him and said Annie E. Weybright, and without unnecessary
