The Petition of Albert S. Brown, trustee in the entitled cause and Ariana S. Care (now Shirmer) Mother and next friend of Warren M. Care, Infant, respectfully shows unto your Honors-----

1. That the Bill of Complaint in this cause was filed on September 15th A.D. 1903 and the Decree therein was entered on November 25th A.D. 1903 appointing Mathias S. Anglemeier and Albert S. Brown, trustees to sell the real estate mentioned in the Bill of Complaint.
2. That the time said Bill was filed there was three mortgages on the property and a number of judgment liens, aggregating in amount a sum beyond the value of the property as the trustees afterward ascertained and for that reason the said trustees filed no bond and did not proceed further with the case, and the matter has been dormant ever since said November 25th, A.D. 1903.
3. That since said appointment as trustee the said Matthias S. Anglemeier has asked to be relieved of the trust and his appearance stricken out as a Solicitor therein, which application has been granted by the order of your Honorable Court.
4. That at the time said Bill was filed the several children and heirs at law of Charles F. Care, deceased, were infants under the age of 21 years whereas the said infant children are now of age except Warren M. Care who is now an infant and about 19 years of age.
5. That the Judgment liens are now expired by limitation and the mortgage indebtedness, -except the sum of \$325.00 with interest from March 18th, A.D. 1914, has been paid by Ariana S. Care to whom the said Mortgages have been assigned by the Mortgagees.
6. That your Oratrix Ariana S. Care is now the wife of J. H. Shermer and reside in Baltimore City, Maryland.
