Utermehle Executor of my last Will and in his place and stead I hereby nominate and appoint my Sister Naomi Utermehle Sole Executrix of my said last Will and testament and I do hereby give devise and bequeath unto my said Executrix her heirs, executors administrators and assigns all the rest and residue of my estate not specifically devised and bequeathed in my said last Will and testament and in this codicil In trust to sell and dispose of the same and valid conveyances thereof to make, and to divide and distribute the net proceeds among all my heirs at law share and share alike. With the exceptions set forth and contained in this my codicil I hereby republish ratify and fully confirm my aforesaid last Will and testament and declare the same to be my last Will and testament.
