7. That the said Harry L. Mehrling died, intestate, at Brunswick, in Frederick County, Maryland, on the date June 11th, in the year 1910, leaving surviving him as his widow the Defendant, Sadie E. Mehrling, who now reside at Brunswick, in Frederick County, Maryland, and who is aged about 42 years, and also leaving surviving him an only child as his heir at law, Nellie Louise Mehrling, who now resides at Brunswick, in Frederick County, Maryland, and who is at this time an infant, having been born on the date May 30th, in the year 1897, and who is also a Defendant in the above entitled cause.

8. The yur Oratrix, Minnie Florence McLane, who was Minnie Florence Mehrling, is now married unto Edward K. McLane and resides with her said husband in Columbia, in Lancaster County, State of Pennsylvania.

9. That your Orator, George T. Mehrling, is now married unto Mamie N. Mehrling, and resides in Frederick County, State of Maryland.

10. That at the time of her death the said Susan Mehrling, wife of said John Mehrling, was seized and possessed of certain pieces or parcels of real estate situated lying and being in Frederick City, in Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, and being more particularly described as follows:

FIRST, all those lots of ground improved with a four brick and one frame dwelling houses situated on the South side of West South Street, in Frederick City, Maryland, being the same real estate as described in the Deed from Richard C. Waters and wife to Susan Mehrling, dated December 18th, 1890, and recorded in Liber W.I.P. No. 11, folios 663, etc., one of the Land Records of Frederick County, Maryland, a duly certified copy of which said deed is herewith filed as a part hereof and marked "Exhibit A",

SECOND, all those lots of ground improved with a double frame and brick back building dwelling house situated on the North side of West South Street, in Frederick City, Maryland, being the same real estate as described in the Deed from Elizabeth Baker et al., to Susan Mehrling, dated May 14th, 1886, and recorded in Liber W.I.P. No. 1, folios 401 etc., one of the Land Records of Frederick County, Maryland, a duly certified copy of which is herewith filed as a part hereof and marked "Exhibit B";-

THIRD, all those lots of ground improved with a frame dwelling house with brick back building, stable and other buildings, situated on the North side of West South Street, in Frederick City, Maryland, being the same real estate as described in the Deed from John Mehrling to Susan Mehrling, dated June 12th, 1882, and Recorded in Liber A.F. No. 5, folios 379 etc., one of the Land Records of Frederick County, Maryland, a duly certified copy of which is herewith filed as a part hereof and marked "Exhibit C";-

11. That said Real Estate cannot be divided without loss and injury to the parties interested, and it will be to the interest and advantage of your orators and also to the interest of the Defendants, that all of said real estate be sold, and the nett proceeds divided among your Orators and the Defendants as they are entitled, and as will appear unto your Orators they will have equitable interest in the premises;- To the end, therefore, your Orators pray:-

1. That the real estate described in said "Exhibit A", "Exhibit B", and "Exhibit C", may be sold by a trustee to be appointed by the Decree of your Honorable Court passed in the premises, to the end that the nett proceeds arising therefrom may be distributed among your Orators and the Defendants as their respective interests may appear.

2. And for such other and further relief in the premises to which your Orators are entitled, and as unto your Honors will appear to be just and equitable.
