Upon the foregoing Petition, Exhibit and affidavit, it is Ordered this 7th day of February A. D. 1916, by the circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the authority thereof, that this Court does hereby assume jurisdiction of the trusts created by the last Will and codicils thereto of Ann R. E. Lambricht, late of Frederick county, deceased, as prayed in the foregoing Petition, and it is further Ordered by the authority aforesaid that said Petitioners and Trustees proceeded to sell the articles of personal property after giving ten days notice thereof, for cash, said notice to be given by advertisement in some newspaper published in Frederick or by handbills as they may deem best, and it is further Ordered that said Trustees proceed to sell the real estate belonging to said trust estate having given at least three weeks previous notice, inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, and such other notice as they may think proper, of the time, place, manner and terms of sale, which terms shall be as follows: One half of the purchase money to be paid in cash on the day of sale, or on ratification thereof by the Court, the residue in six months from the day of sale, the purchaser or purchasers giving his/her or their notes with approved security and bearing interest from the day of sale, or all cash at the option of the purchaser, and it is further ordered that said Trustees shall make report of their proceedings to this Court, but before proceeding to act it is Ordered that said Trustees give Bond to the State of Maryland, in the usual form in the penalty of Six Thousand Dollars conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in them, by this order and decree or that may be reposed in them by any future order or decree in the premises,

EXHIBIT A.

I, Ann R. E. Lambricht of Frederick County and City, Maryland, do make, publish and declare this my last Will and testament in the manner and form following: After all my just debts and funeral expenses are paid, I give, devise and bequeath as follows:--

1. I give, and devise unto my brother William Adams my house and lot situated on the West side of North Market Street, which is now occupied by Bradley McHenry.
2. I give and bequeath unto my nephew Dorsey C. Adams Five hundred Dollars; to my niece Grace K. Adams Four Hundred Dollars; to my niece Annie E. Adams Four Hundred Dollars, and to my nephew Eddie E. Adams Five Hundred Dollars.
3. I give and bequeath unto my sister in law Vinnie K. Adams (wife of Edward E. Adams) and unto my sister in law Mary Adams (wife of William Adams) each the sum of fifty dollars, making \$100.00 to the two.
4. I give and bequeath unto Mrs. Rosa Wills (widow of George Wills) the sum of twenty five dollars provided she survives me.
5. I give and devise unto my nephew John Adams the lot of ground in the north-west Addition to Frederick which was conveyed to me by Worthington, Rohrback and Keedy Trustees, by deed duly recorded.
6. I direct my executor hereinafter named to expend to hundred dollars for tombstones for myself and husband and fifty dollars, or so so much thereof as may be necessary, for suitable corner-stones for my lot in the cemetery.
