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To the Honorable, the Judges of said Court;:-

The Petition of John W. Tabler, of Frederick County, Maryland, respectfully represents unto your Honors;:-

1. That he is the brother of the said Mary Elizabeth Turner, who is a resident of said County and State, and that the said Mary Elizabeth Turner has for a number of years past resided in Urbana District, in said County and State, on the road leading from what is known as Tablers Tell Gate to Menrevia, and that the said Mary Elizabeth Turner is now and has been for a period of several months, last past, of unsound mind and insane, without lucid intervals, and that she is not capable of the government of herself or of the management of her estate.
2. That the said Mary Elizabeth Turner is the wife of a certain Lewis Turner, who has been married to and resided with the said Mary Elizabeth Turner for a number of years past, but that the said Lewis Turner has not taken proper care of his said wife and she has been removed from her home where she resided with him and is now confined in the Maryland State Hospital for the Insane of Maryland, at Sykesville, Maryland, and that the said Lewis Turner, because of his intemperate habits and indolence, is not a proper person to have the care and custody of the person and estate of the said Mary Elizabeth Turner.
3. That the said Mary Elizabeth Turner is possessed of a certain tract of real estate situate in Urbana District, in said County and State, consisting of about 42 acres of land, and she is also the owner of certain valuable personal property consisting of live stock, to wit, horses and cattle, and farming implements and furniture and that it would be to the best interest, benefit and advantage of the said Mary Elizabeth Turner to have some suitable person appointed as a Committee to have charge of
