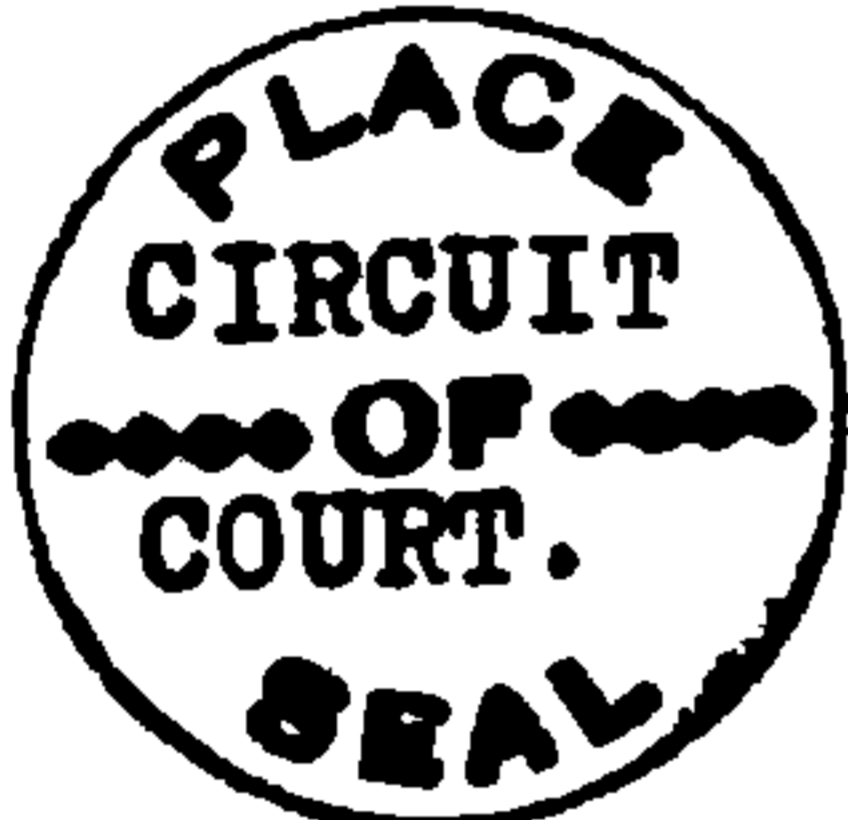

Writ DE LUNATICO INQUIRENDO
STATE OF MARYLAND, Frederick County, to wit!-
State of Maryland, to the Sheriff of Frederick County.
GREETINGS!-

Because, we have received information that Alice Mobley a resident of Frederick County, Inmate of Montivue Hospital, Frederick County, Maryland, is now and has been for some years past of unsound mind and a lunatic, without lucid intervals, and that she is not capable of the government of herself or the management of her property, and estate and your petitioner files herewith the affidavit of Dr. Bernard O. Thomas deposing to the insanity of said Alice Mobley.

That the said Alice Mobley is the owner of a tract of land in Urbana District, in Frederick County which together with the improvements thereon, is worth about eight hundred dollars, and there is no one legally authorized to manage the same for her use and support, and that it would be to her benefit to appoint a suitable person as committee and trustee of her person and estate.

Wherefore your petitioner prays your Honors, that a commission may be issued to the Sheriff of Frederick County, to inquire into the lunacy of the said Alice Mobley.

And we do command you that you diligently inquire by the Oaths of honest and lawful men of your bailiwick by whom the truth of the matter may be better known, whether the said Alice Mobley is now and has been for some time past of unsound mind and a lunatic, and not capable of the government of herself or the management of her estate? And whether she be possessed of real estate or Personal property, and of what nature and description, and of what value, and who is next of kin, and of what age? And the inquisition hereof, distinctly and plainly made, send to our Judges of the Circuit Court, for Frederick County, sitting in Equity, under your hand and seal, and the hands and seal of those by whom the said inquisition is made and taken.
