th ir oaths and affirmations to inquire etc., witnesseth:

The the said Jurors aforesaid do find that the said Alice Mobley, in said writ named
is of unsound mond and a lunatic, without lucid intervals, so that she is not capable
of the goverment of her self or the management of her estate, and that she has been
in that state of mind for about 40 years past, but how she became so, the jurors afore
said cannot say, unless by the visitation of God.

And the jurors aforesaid do also find that the said Alice Mobley, is seized and
possessed of certain real estate in Urbana District, in said Frederick County, known
as the Park Mills Store property valued at about Six Hundred Dollars nor do they
find that she has when in such unsound mind, aliened any part thereof; and that the
nearest of kin of the said Alice Mobley are the following; W. J. Mobley. C. D. Mobley
J. D. Mobley half brothers, and Nina Fisher and Howard Mobley children of a deceased
half brother and that her heirs at law are the same parties all of whom are of full
