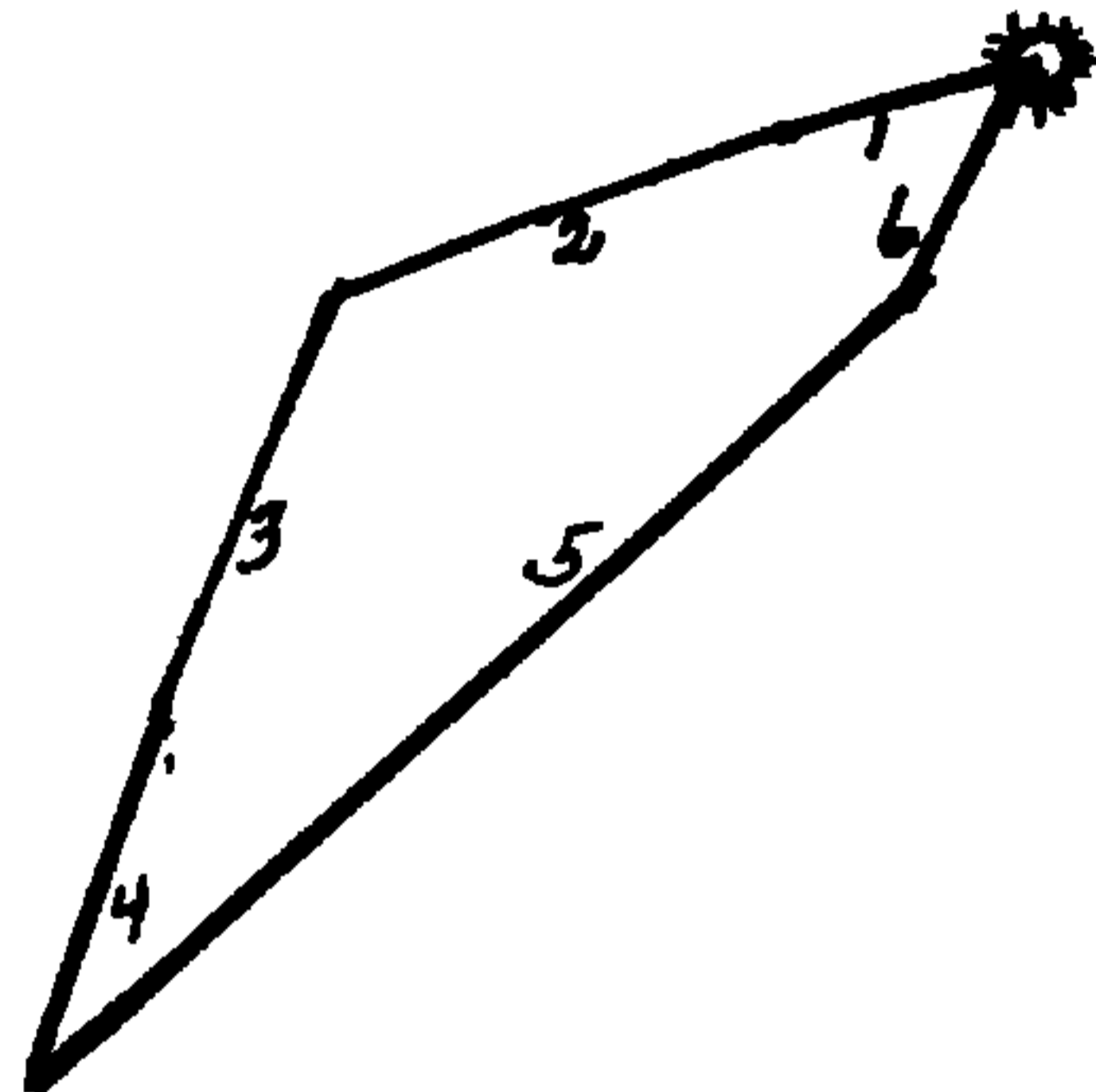


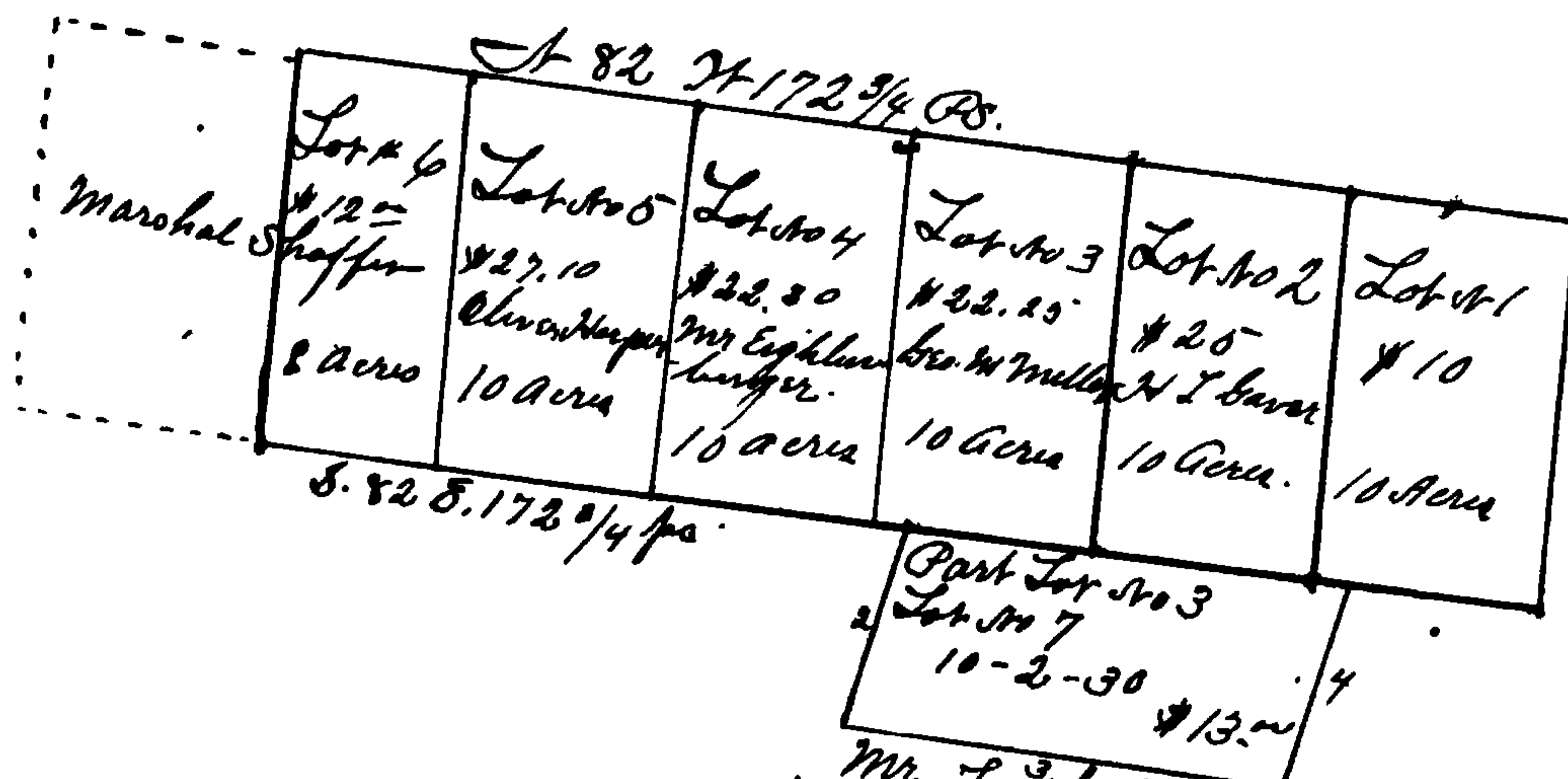

One of the Land Records of Frederick County, said piece or parcel of land, being part of a tract of land called Sandy Run, beginning for the same at a stone planted at the end of the 9th or S 76 E.113 ps line of  $\frac{200-3-30}{200-3-30}$  of land conveyed by Frederick Cronice & wife to Samuel Devilbiss by deed dated 19th March 1842 it also being at the end of the 16 or S.85 $\frac{1}{2}$  E.18 $\frac{1}{2}$  ps line of Cronices Prospect, Reserved for Frederick Cronice 22nd April 1841 and running thence by and with the outlines of the said  $\frac{200-3-30}{200-3-30}$  deed 4 courses Viz S.17 E.15 $\frac{3}{4}$  ps, S.17 E.16 $\frac{1}{4}$  ps, S.52 E.40 ps, S.70 E.24  $\frac{9}{10}$  ps, to the end of the 18th or S.41 $\frac{1}{2}$  E.74 ps, line of the Cronices Prospect aforesaid thence by and with the outlines of said tract reversed 2 courses Viz N.41 $\frac{1}{2}$  W.74 ps to a stone N.54 $\frac{1}{2}$  W.17 $\frac{1}{2}$  ps, to the Beginning Containing 6 $\frac{1}{4}$  Acres more or less, The above tract lies immediately contiguous to the east side of the farm and is locally known as the Blue Sod Lot.
