

of accounts, vouchers, papers, deeds, leases, contracts, bills, notes, accounts, money, or other property in his or their hands, or under his or their control, and they are hereby commanded and required to obey and to conform to such order as may be given them from time to time by the said receiver, or his duly constituted representative in conducting the said business and discharging his duty as such receiver. And said receiver is hereby fully authorized to continue and operate the business of the said Company as heretofore conducted and manage all its property, at his discretion, in such manner as will in his judgment produce the most satisfactory results; and to collect and receive all income therefrom and all debts due said Company of every kind, and for such purposes he is hereby vested with full power at his discretion to employ and discharge and fix a compensation of all such officers, counsel, managers, agents and employes as may be required for the purpose of discharging his duties as such receiver.

And the said receiver is hereby directed to deposit the monies coming into his hands in some bank or banks in the City of Washington, District of Columbia, and to report his selection to the Court. And said receiver is hereby authorized and empowered to institute and prosecute all such suits as may be necessary in his judgment to the proper protection of the property and trusts hereby invested in him, and likewise to defend all action instituted against him as receiver, and also to appear in and to conduct the prosecution or defense of any and all suits or proceedings now pending in any Court against said Company, the prosecution or defense of which will in the judgment of said receiver, be necessary and proper for the protection of the property or rights placed in his charge and for the interest of the creditors and stockholders of the Company.

The said receiver is hereby required to give bond in the sum of \$25,000, with surety satisfactory to the Court, for the faithful discharge of his duty, and the said receiver is required to make and file full reports in this Court quarterly. And the Court reserves the right, by order hereafter to be made, to direct and control the payment of all supplies, materials and other claims and in all respects to regulate and control the conduct of said receiver. And it is further ordered and decreed that Continental Trust Company of Washington District of Columbia be and he hereby is appointed trustee in the place and stead of the United States Trust Company under the deed of trust from the White Cross Milk Company, Incorporated, to the said United States Trust Company, dated September 30th 1913, and recorded October 1st, 1913, among the Land Records of the District of Columbia, in Liber 3663, folio 101, et seq., conveying certain land and property located in Frederick, Maryland, and in the City of Washington, District of Columbia, to secure a bond issue of the White Cross Milk Company, Incorporated, and that all the right, title, interest and estate at law or in Equity, and all the powers that were conveyed to and vested in the United States Trust Company as trustee under the said deed of trust, be and the same hereby are vested in the said Continental Trust Company as trustee, and said trustee shall have full power and authority to execute the said trusts contained in said deed of trust.
