

The answer of William L. Browning and Charles McC. Mathias, Receivers in the above entitled matter, to the Petition of Elmer K. Ramsburg, filed in your Honorable Court, respectfully shows:-

1. That the said William L. Browning and Charles McC. Mathias, Receivers, deny that they have in their hands belonging to the said Elmer K. Ramsburg the sum of Seventy seven Dollars and eighty five cents (\$77.85), as shown by statement "Exhibit No.1" filed with said petition, but submit the following facts in regard to said matter to your Honorable Court, as follows:-The said Elmer K. Ramsburg is the proprietor of a milk route, hauling daily shipments of milk from the farmers living in his neighborhood to the plant of The White Cross Milk Company, and by an agreement between the said Elmer K. Ramsburg, the several shippers for whom he acts as a common carrier, and the White Cross Milk Company, the said Elmer K. Ramsburg received for his services of hauling the sum of twenty-five cents (25¢) per hundred pounds; fifteen cents (15¢) per hundred pounds of the said 25¢ being deducted by the White Cross Milk Company from the amounts due by said Company to the several shippers of milk as their share of said expense, and the sum of Ten Cents (10¢) per hundred pounds being paid by the said White Cross Milk Company to the said Elmer K. Ramsburg as its share of said expense for his services in hauling the milk.
2. That the said Elmer K. Ramsburg, according to Statement "Exhibit No.1" filed with the petition, was entitled to receive for his services, in accordance with the agreement above set forth, the sum of Forty-five Dollars and two cents (\$45.02), the total of the amounts deducted from the several shippers whose milk was hauled by the said Elmer K. Ramsburg; and the sum of Thirty-two Dollars and Eighty-three cents (\$32.83) the amount due from the Company to the said Elmer K. Ramsburg, as the Company's share of said hauling expenses.
3. That the said sum of Seventy-seven Dollars and Eighty-five cents (\$77.85) is claimed for services rendered between April 16th and 26th, inclusive, and that your Respondents were appointed Receivers of the White Cross Milk Company by your Honorable Court on the 27th day of April, 1916, so that the claim of the said Elmer K. Ramsburg accrued for services rendered the White Cross Milk Company and the individual shippers prior to the date of said Receivership.

WHEREFORE, your Respondants having fully answered said petition of Elmer K. Ramsburg, and having submitted all the facts in their possessions in reference thereto, submit the question as to the payment of said sum to your Honorable Court, and will abide by and perform such order as your Honors may see fit to pass. And as in duty, etc.,

The answer of the Receivers to the foregoing Petition having been read and considered, and the Court being of opinion that the sum of \$45.02 is held by them in trust for Elmer K. Ramsburg, in pursuance of an agreement heretofore entered into by and between the White Cross Milk Company and Elmer K. Ramsburg and others, and being further of opinion that the remaining part of the claim of 77.85 to wit:- the sum of \$32.83 is due for work and labor in large part done and performed by the petitioner within a few days prior to the appointment of the Receivers. It is thereupon this 17th day of July 1916, Ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a court of Equity and duly qualified thereof, that the Receivers in the above entitled cause pay to Elmer K. Ramsburg, the petitioner and claimant herein, the sum of \$77 and 85/100 Dollars, in full for his claim for services and hauling as set forth in said Petition.
