ORDER CONFIRMING DECREE OF THE SUPREME COURT OF THE
DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA.

Upon consideration of the petition of William L. Browning and Charles McC. Mathias, receivers of the White Cross Milk Company, Incorporated, filed herein on the 23rd day of October, 1916, and it appearing to the Court that there is a urgent necessity for the receivers of the company to borrow the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) in order to produce funds essential to be used in the operation of its business, and that the order of the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia authorizing and directing the issuance of said Receiver's certificates should be in all respects confirmed and the certificates issued pursuant to said order, should become a prior lien upon the assets and property of the defendant, White Cross Milk Company, within the State of Maryland. It is be the Court that 23rd day of October, 1916, ordered, adjudged and decreed that the said order of the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia, dated the 20th day of October, 1916, authorizing and empowering William L. Browning to borrow the sum of Four Thousand Dollars (\$4,000.00) and to issue therefore four certain certificates, as receivers, for the sum of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000). each, bearing interest at the rate of six per centum (6%) per annum from date and maturing on or before the first day of January, 1917, and creating said certificates a first lien on all and singular the property and assets of the defendant, White Cross Milk Company, prior to the lien of the deed of trust or mortgage, and the same is hereby in all respects confirmed as fully as if said order had been passed by this Court in this cause, and the said Receiver's certificates, when issued in accordance with the provisions of said order of the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia, shall become a prior lien on all the assets and property of the defendant, White Cross Milk Company, within the State of Maryland and shall be prior in right to the mortgage deed of trust heretofore executed by the said defendant, White Cross Milk Company.
