

belonging to the said Charles W. Chipley the sum of Ninety four Dollars and fifty-six cents (\$94.56), as shown by statement, Exhibit No. 1, filed with said petition, but submit the following facts in regard to said matter to your Honorable Court, to-wit:

The said Charles Chipley is the proprietor of a milk route, hauling daily shipments of milk from the farmers living in his neighborhood of the White Cross Milk Company, and by an agreement between the said Charles Chipley, the several shippers for whom he acts as a common carrier, and the White Cross Milk Company, the said Charles Chipley received for his service for hauling the sum of fifteen cents (15c) per one hundred pounds from all shippers residing in the neighborhood of Walkersville, and twenty-five cents (25c) per one hundred pounds from all shippers living between Walkersville and New Midway, the said amount being deducted by the White Cross Milk Company from the amounts due by said Company to the several shippers of milk, as their share of said expenses, and the said Company paying the further sum of five cents (5c) per one hundred pounds as an additional compensation for hauling said milk.

2nd. That the said Charles Chipley, according to statement, Exhibit No. 1, filed with the petition, as entitled to receive for his services, in accordance with the agreement above set forth, the sum of fifty eight dollars and sixteen cents (\$58.16), the total of the amount deducted from the several shippers, whose milk was hauled by the said Charles Chipley, from April 15th, to the date of the appointment of receivers to-wit April 27th, the sum of Fifteen Dollars and forty-eight cents (\$15.48), the amount due from the Company to the said Charles Chipley as the company's share for said hauling expense, and the further sum of Twenty Dollars and Ninety-two cents (\$20.92), being the amount due by the said company to the said Charles Chipley for milk hauling at five cents (5c) per one hundred pounds, between April 1st and April 15th.

WHEREFORE, your respondents having fully answered the petition of said Charles Chipley, and have submitted all the facts in their possession in reference thereto, submit the question as to the payment of the said sum to your Honorable Court, and will abide by and perform such order as your Honors may see fit to pass.

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REPORT AND PETITION OF WILLIAM L. BROWNING AND CHARLES McC. MATHIAS, ANCILLARY RECEIVERS OF THE WHITE CROSS MILK COMPANY, INCORPORATED.

To the Honorable the Judges of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, Maryland.

The report and petition of William L. Browning and Charles McC. Mathias, Ancillary Receivers, respectfully represent unto the Court as follows:

1. That the petitioner William L. Browning, who was by order of the Supreme Court of the District of Columbia passed on the 27th day of November, A. D. 1916, appointed Receiver in the original proceedings in a cause pending in the said Supreme Court of the District of Columbia between Frederick Mertens and others, trading as F. Mertens' Sons, plaintiffs, and the White Cross Milk Company, defendants, of all the property and assets
