

within the District of Columbia of the defendant the White Cross Milk Company, duly filed his certain report and petition in which said report and petition the Continental Trust Company, Substituted Trustee under a mortgage given by the White Cross Milk Company to secure its outstanding bond issue, reported to said Court an offer to purchase all of the tangible assets, trade-name, good will and other properties of the White Cross Milk Company within the District of Columbia and the State of Maryland and elsewhere, with the exception of cash and cash items on hand and bills and accounts receivable, for the sum of Twenty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$27,500), payment to be made in cash, said offer being submitted by the Borden's Farm Products Division; a copy of said petition being hereunto annexed and marked "Exhibit A", and is prayed to be taken and read as a part hereof as fully as if set forth verbatim herein.

2. That pursuant to said petition an order was passed by the said Supreme Court of the District of Columbia accepting said offer upon the terms set forth in the petition and ratified and confirmed said sale unless cause to the contrary be shown to said court before the 15th day of December, 1916, provided a copy of said order be published in each of the two successive issues of the Washington Law Reporter and twice per week in the Evening Star, and transferring all liens, claims and demands of all parties to the fund so derived from the sale of said property, a certified copy of said order being hereunto annexed and marked "Exhibited B" and your petitioners pray that same may be taken and read as a part hereof as fully as if set forth verbatim herein.

3. That for the reason set forth in the petition of William L. Browning, and the Continental Trust Company, Substituted Trustee, your petitioners are both of the opinion that the offer made by the Borden Company is a very danger advantageous one, and that it is decidedly for the best interest of all parties concerned that said offer be accepted and a sale be made to the said Borden Company, in accordance with the terms of its offer and that the said offer is much the best which your Ancillary Receivers have been able to secure. WHEREFORE THE PREMISES CONSIDERED, Your petitioners pray that an order may be passed by this Honorable Court authorizing and directing William L. Browning and Charles McC. Mathias, as Ancillary Receivers, to accept the said offer of the Borden's Farm Products Division and to convey the property of the White Cross Milk Company within the State of Maryland free and discharged of any and all liens, said liens to be transferred to the fund received from the sale, and in all respects to ratify and confirm the order and original proceedings herein in the District of Columbia.
