

O R D E R.

Upon consideration of the petition this day filed by William L. Browning, receiver of the White Cross Milk Company, Incorporated, and of the Continental Trust Company of the District of Columbia, Substituted Trustee, under a deed of Trust securing a bond issue of the said defendant White Cross Milk Company, Incorporated, and after argument of counsel thereon and due consideration thereof, it is this 27th day of November, A.D. 1916, ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED:

That the offer of the Borden's Farm Products Division of New York of Twenty-Seven Thousand Dollars and Five Hundred (\$27,500.00) for all of the property real, personal and mixed of the White Cross Milk Company, Incorporated, within the State of Maryland, and the District of Columbia and elsewhere (excepting its cash and cash items, bills and accounts receivable), together with the good will, trade name and business of said Company, upon the terms set forth in said petition, be, and the same is hereby accepted and the sale of the said property to the said Borden's Farm Product Division, in accordance with said offer made by it to William L. Browning, Receiver, be, and the same is hereby ratified and confirmed, unless cause to the contrary be shown before the 15th day of December, 1916, provided a copy of this order be published in each of two successive issues of the Washington Law Reporter, and twice per week for two successive weeks in The Evening Star of Washington, D.C. prior to the expiration of said period; and upon the payment of the purchase money therefor the said William L. Browning, as Receiver, and the Continental Trust Company of the District of Columbia, as Substituted Trustee, are hereby authorized, empowered and directed to convey unto the said Borden's Farm Products Division the property of the White Cross Milk Company, Incorporated, real, personal, and mixed (excepting its cash and cash items, bills and accounts receivable), together with the good will, trade notes and business of said company, free, clear and discharged of all liens, claims and demands of any and all parties; and upon payment of the purchase money, as aforesaid, the said Receiver is hereby authorized and directed to report the same to this Court for its further order and direction.

And it is further ORDERED, adjudged and decreed that the proceeds of sale shall be held subject to the same priority of liens as now exist upon and subsist as to the property sold.
