The Petition of W.A.Simpson, respectfully shows unto your Honors:-

First! That hereafter, on the 19th day of December 1916, your petitioner submits in writing, his offer to purchase the plant, assets etc., of the White Cross Milk Company, from Messers. Browning and Mathias, receivers in this cause, at and for the sum of Thirty One Thousand Dollars (\$31,000.00).

Second! That, at the time of submitting this bid, your petitioner delivered to the said Receivers his certified check for One Thousand Dollars (\$1,00.00) payable to their order.

Third! That at the suggestion of this Court, your Petitioner had this day delivered to Charles McC Mathias, one of the Receivers, a second certified check for Four Thousand making Five Thousand Dollars the entire amount now deposited with said receivers, as an evidence of his good faith to carry out in full his offer to purchase said plant, assets etc.,

WHEREFORE, The premises considered, your petitioner prays that his offer heretofore submitted in writing may be accepted and the plant, assets etc., of said White Cross Milk Company be conveyed and delivered to him, giving him a good and marketable title to the same.

The Petition of William L. Browning and Charles McC. Mathias, Ancillary Receivers in the above entitled cause, respectfully shows unto your Honors!

1. That by a petition heretofore filed by your Petitioners, on the first day of December, 1916, your Petitioners reported to your Honorable Court the offer of the Bordens Farm Products Division for the property of the White Cross Milk Company, at and for the sum of Twenty-seven Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$27,500), and that since said time on December 19, 1916, there has been submitted to your Honorable Court an offer of Thirty-one Thousand Dollars (\$31,000) for said property of the White Cross Milk Company.

2. That your Petitioners believe a sale of said property is about to be consummated, and that by the provisions of said decretal order appointing your petitioners Ancillary Receivers in the above entitled matter, it was provided that additional bond should be given by your petitioners, in such amount as your Honorable Court may name, before a sale of the real estate in said Company was affected. WHEREFORE YOUR PETITIONERS PRAY that your Honorable Court may pass an order authorizing and directing your petitioners to furnish additional bond in the above entitled matter, in such amount as your Honors may seem just and proper.
