4. That your Petitioners are advised that the above are referred claims against the proceeds of sale of said property, and inasmuch as said debts are drawing interest at the rate of 6% your Petitioner asks leave of your Honorable Court to pay the same forthwith.

2nd. That the said Martha J. Attick after executing the said Will and in or about September A.D. 1889, died, and letters testamentary on her estate were issued to your Complainant, and in pursuance thereof and in accordance with said last will and testament your Complainant has entered upon his duties in settling up said personal estate.

3. That the said Martha J. Attick in addition to her personal estate, left certain valuable real estate situated in Frederick County, Frederick City, Maryland, being two houses and lots on the West end of Church Street in said City, and which are fully described in the deeds for the same herewith filed marked Exhibits Nos 2 and 3.
