

1. That after the signing of the decree in this cause the said Trustee gave bond in the penalty prescribed in said decree with satisfactory securities, conditioned for the faithful performance of the trust reposed in them by said decree, which bond was duly approved by the Clerk of the said Court and was then filed in his office as was required by law.
2. That thereafter the said Trustees duly advertised for sale the real estate described to be sold by advertisements inserted in the "Citizen" and the daily News" two newspapers published in Frederick County, for three weeks prior to the day of sale, as will appear by reference to copies of said advertisements herewith filed, and marked Exhibits Nos 1 and 2; which as well as all other Exhibits herewith filed, it is prayed may be taken as a part hereof as fully as if herein at large in words and figures set forth.
