TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The petition of Mary O. Smith, and of Mary O. Smith as mother and next friend of Harry E. Smith, infant, respectfully represents unto your Honors:

1. That said Mary O. Smith is the mother of the said Harry E. Smith, infant aged 9 years, and that they are residents of Howard County, Maryland, now temporarily in Frederick City, Frederick County.
2. That a certain Harry H. Smith, late of Frederick County, deceased, was in his life time and at the time of his death seized and possessed of certain real estate, located in said Frederick County, Maryland, being a tract of land at the town of Woodsboro, in said County, containing about 4 acres, being unimproved, and described in a deed from George D. Barrick and others to the said Harry H. Smith, dated March 13, 1906, and recorded in Liber S. T. H. No. 274, folio 412, one of the land records of said Frederick County, and said deed is herewith filed as a part of this petition and marked "Exhibit A".
3. That said Harry H. Smith being so seized and possessed of said real estate, departed this life, intestate, in May, 1907, leaving surviving him, a widow, the said Mary O. Smith, now aged 35 years, and the said Harry E. Smith, an infant son, to whom said real estate descended.
4. That said real estate cost \$575.00, and is unimproved and yields and income of only \$15.00 per year, which barely pays the taxes and other fixed charges on said real
