7.Int. Are the wooden buildings pine or hemlock?

6.X.Int. Is it not a fact that Mr. Neill was present at the time the statement was read to you?

7.X.Int. You were to complete the Brick building were you not?

Ans. My recollection was that Kamberger was to do it with the money he was to put in that is the \$9000.

RE-DIRECT EXAMINATION.

1.Int. Was he to pay \$9000. and the building to be completed at your expense or was he to pay 9000. and the building to be completed at the expense of both of you?

RE-CROSS-EXAMINATION.
