the interest and advantage of both the infants and other persons interested therein, that the contract for the sale of the real estate of the late reorge J. Hoffman, now belonging to his children, four of whom are infants, namely, Miriam E. Chaney, Frank M. Hoffman, Henry C. Hoffman and George M. Huffman, made an their behalf by their mother, Hannah E. Huffman, to Thomas Sim Nusbaum and Ella M. Nusbaum, for the price of one hundred and fifty dollars (\$150.00) be ratified and confirmed by the Court.

It is thereupon this 28th day of March, 1917, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the Authority thereof, adjudged, ordered and decreed that the said sale of the real estate mentioned in these proceedings, be and the same is hereby finally ratified and confirmed.
