8. That the aforesaid lots or parcels of land still appear upon the Land Records for Frederick County, in the name of Thomas Hickman. That at the time of the purchase of the aforesaid real estate the said Thomas Hickman was acting as the Agent and Trustee of his wife, your Oratrix aforesaid, as well as for himself, for the purpose of carrying out and fullfilling the verbal agreement into which they had entered, to wit, that the real estate should have been conveyed to then as tenants by the entireties.

9. Your Oratrix alleges that the said Deed of March 29th, 1913, was executed to her husband, the said Thomas Hickman, in direct violation of the agreement which she had with him, and in fraud of her rights, and that unless said deed of March 29th, 1913 is declared null and void, and a conveyance of said real estate be made to your Oratrix by the said Joseph H. Hamilton, she will suffer irreparable loss and damage; that your Oratrix has no adequate remedy at law, and will be defrauded of her rights unless she is aided by the interposition of a Court of Equity.

Wherefore Your Oratrix prays your Monors to pass an order of your Honorable Court decreeing and adjudicating the said deed of March 29th, 1913, from the said Joseph H. Hamilton to the said Thomas Hickman to be null and void and of no effect, and directing and requiring the said Joseph H. Hamilton to execute a deed for said lots or parcels of land mentioned in said deed, to the said Gertrude E. Hickman.

May it please your Honors to grant unto your Oratrix the writ of sub-poens against the defendants, Annie Kroeger and Conrad Kreeger her husband, William Hickman; Catharine Hickman; Ida Garrick and Louise Garrick her husband; Mama Oettinger and Rudolph Oettinger her husband, Josephine Hickman and Joseph H. Hamilton, and Charles Hickman and Anna Hickman his wife, commandeing them and each of them to be and appear in this Court on some day certain to be named in said writ, to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein.
