pigs; and the place had a wire fence he put around there which cost him \$100.00 for the fence.

(Counsel for the Plaintiff excepts to such portion of the aforegoing answer

that relates to any conversation witness had with any one else.

- 5. Do you know of any other personal property besides what you stated? (Excepted to)
- A. I didn't see it that day. I knew he was the owner of a horse and wagon but I didn't see it, I didn't have time to see it.
- 6. Are you familiar with the value of potatoes?
- A. Yes sir.
- 7. Have you been in the business of dealing in such articles?
- A. Yes sir, spent two months of each year until the last six or seven years in that line; been born and raised in the huokestering business.
- 8. What, in your opinion, was the value of those potatoes at that time? (Excepted to)
- A. He told me about those potatoes; he told me he bought a snap on this lot of potatoes; I don't just remember whether he told me he paid sixty or seventy sixty five cents a bushel.
- 9. What, in your opinion, would be the value of those potatoes; as a dealer what would they be worth to you at that time? (Excepted to)
- A. I dealt in potatoes in the month of July and Augustpwhich you know there is a change in the price in November. Potatoes at that time were considered to be a high price potatoe.eighty or ninety cents per bushel, of times up to \$1.10 for them.
- 10. Do you know anything about the payment of the funeral expenses of your brother bu your mother?
- A. Yes sir.
- 11. Tell us what you know about it? (Excepted to)
- A. I have seen the receipt for it was but but I wan't there when she paid it.

(CROSS EXAMINATION)

- 1x. You stated that in your opinion there were sixty bushels of potatoes and a quantity of caned goods, prehaps \$25.00 worth, in that store.
- A. Yes sir, not only canned goods but other articles in the store.
- 2x. How gould your estimate the quantity either of potatoes or canned goods when you anly looked, as you admit, through the window from the street and the window was dirty?
- A. I cinsider I have got good eyesight and they were nt over fifteen feet from me; I consider I have a wonderful eyesight.
- 3x. Were the potatoes in a pile?
- A. In bags.
- 4x. Could you tell how many bags you saw?
- A. About forty ot fifty-five bags of potatoes, in Scotch sacks.
- 5x. Did you count the sacks?
- A. No sir, I didn't; I could estimate.
- 6x. Were you lying on the floor or behind the counter?
- A. There was one course lying on the floor and the other were on top of them.
- 7x. Do you know the condition of those potatoes?
- A. No sir, I do not.
- 8x. Do you know the kind and character of canned goods you stated you saw on the shelves?
- A. Yes sir, I canned them.
- 9x. What were they?
- A. Tomatoes and pears.
- 10x. How many cans weremon the shelves?
- A. I didn't stay long enough to count them but I know what it costs to stock a store, I have had dealings in a store, my mother here has always run a store up until a few years.
