ORDER OF PUBLICATION

No. 9556 EQUITY. In the Circuit Court for Frederick County.

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The object of this bill is to procure a decree for the sale of a certain tract or parcel of land in Frederick County, State of Maryland,

The bill states that a certain Hannah Harwetel departed this life in Frederick County, Maryland, on or about the 5th day of June, A.D. 1911, intestate seized and possessed of a certain tract or parcel of land containing 32 square perches, more or less, located in Ladiesburg, Frederick County, State of Maryland, which was conveyed to the said Hannah Harwetel by Laura V. Fox and Franklin C. Fox, her husband, by deed dated February 14, 1902 and recorded among the land Records of Frederick County in Liber D.H.H. No. 13, folio 638, a certified copy of said deed is filed among the proceedings marked Exhibit "A", and prayed to be taken together with all other exhibits as part of the bill.

That the said Hannah Harwetel at the time of her death left surviving her the following children as her only heirs at law and next of kin, viz: A daughter, Mary E. Eiler, who is intermarried with Charles R. Eiler, residents of Carroll County, Maryland, A son, Marshall C. Harwetel, whose wife's name is Emma J. Harwetel, residents at 1814 Philadelphia Avenue, Baltimore, Md, A daughter, Lulu B. Harwetel, single, residing in Ladiesburg, Frederick County, Maryland, A daughter, Ella M. Birely, who is intermarried with William F. Birely, and residing in Ladiesburg, Frederick County, Maryland, A son, Charles B. Allison, whose wife's name is Mary Catharine Allison, residents of New Bedford, State of Massachusetts, and nonresidents of the State of Maryland. That the aforesaid real estate is of the value of about \$2000, and upon the death of the said intestate, Hannah Harwetel, descended to and vested in the aforesaid children of the said Hannah Harwetel, subject to the dower interest therein of Lewis Harwetel, widower of the said Hannah Harwetel. That the said Lewis Harwetel departed this life in said Frederick County on or about November 8, 1916. That the aforesaid real estate is not susceptible of partition without material loss and injury to the parties in interest therein as above stated and that in order to make division of said interests it will be necessary that said real estate be sold and the proceeds thereof divided
