

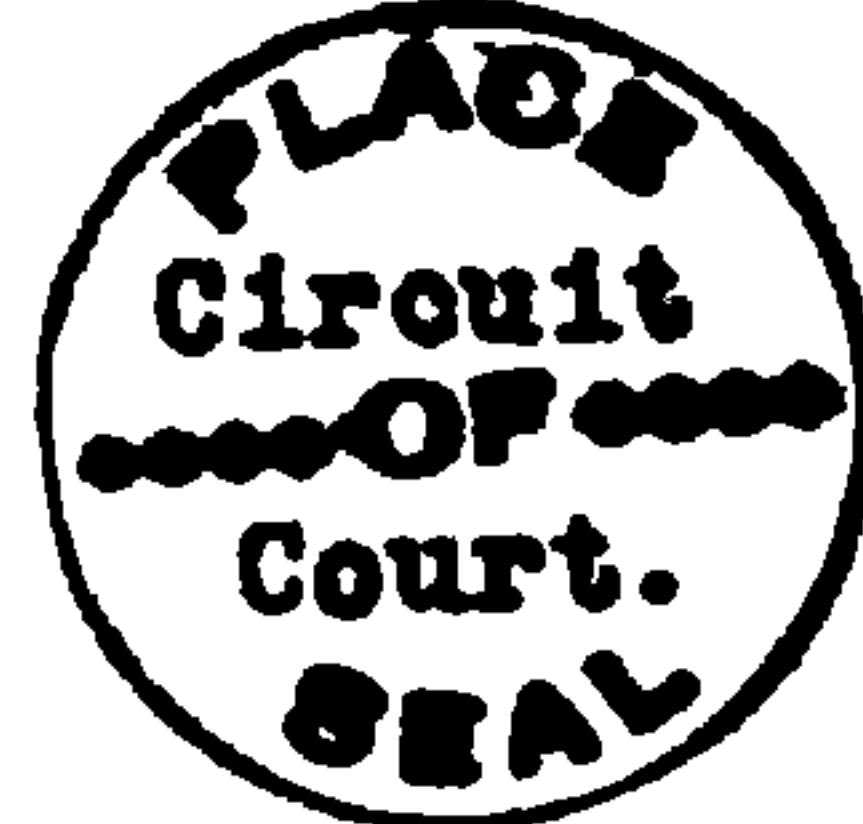

The Bill of Complaint of the First National Bank of Monrovia, Maryland, a body corporate, that sues on its own behalf and on behalf of all the others Creditors of Emanuel Stup, late of Frederick County and State of Maryland, deceased, who will come in and contribute to the expenses of this suit respectfully shows unto your Honor--That a certain Emanuel Stup was in his lifetime, and at the time of his death as hereinafter set forth, indebted unto the Complainants, The 1st National Bank of Monrovia, Maryland, a body corporate, in the sum of Four Hundred Dollars for money loaned the said Emanuel Stup on September 20th, A.D. 1915, on the joint and several promissory note of the said Emanuel Stup and Zacharah T. Windsor and Fannie E. Windsor for the sum of \$400.00, payable six months after its date, for value received, as will appear by a certified copy of said note herewith filed and marked Exhibit No. 1 which together with all other Exhibits herewith filed it is prayed may be taken and considered as a part of this Bill of Complaint.

2nd--That the said Emanuel Stup being so indebted to your Orator and to divers other persons, firms and Corporations, departed this life Intestate on or about the latter part on the month of January, A.D. 1916, seized and possessed of certain real estate situate, lying and being in Frederick County, and State of Maryland, which said real estate are fully described in the two deeds for the same herewith filed and marked Exhibit No. 2 and No. 3.

3rd--That the said Emanuel Stup left surviving him as his heirs at law the following children, all of whom are adults and residents of Frederick County and State of Maryland, as follows, to-wit--A son Charles W. Stup whose wife's name is Annie E. Stup! a son David T. Stup whose wife's name is Hester C. Stup, a son John C. Stup whose wife's
