The Bill of Complaint further states that the property therein mentioned is not susceptible of division among the parties thereunto entitled, without graet loss and injury, and that it would be for the benefit and advantage of all paties to the proceedings, and especially the infant defendants that said real estate be sold under the direction of the Court, and the proceeds therefrom distributed among the parties entitled thereto.

That the real estate of the said Isaac Michael, deceased, may be sold by the Trustee to be appointed by the Court, and the proceeds therefrom distributed among the parties entitled thereto, under the Direction of the Court, and for such other and further relief as the nature and equity of the case may require. It is thereupon, this 14th day of September, in the year 1916, ORDERED by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity that the Complainants, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks, before the 21st day of October, 1916, give notice to the absent defendants of the object and substance of this Bill, warning them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor, on or before the 7th day of November, A.D. 1916, and show cause, if any they have, why a decree ought not to be passed as prayed.
