The petition and report of sales of Henry S.Boyle and John Brooke Boyle,trustees in above entitled cause,respectfully represents unto your Honors!:-

That,pursuant to the terms of the decree passed in the above entitled cause,your petitioners qualified as said trustees,giving their bond to the State of Maryland conditioned on the faithful performance of their duties in the premises;and thereupon gave three weeks public notice,of the time, place,manner and terms of sale,by advertisement inserted in the News,a newspaper published in Frederick County,Maryland,and pursuant to said notice,attended on the premises on the 28th.day of September,1912,at the hour of 11 A.M.the time and place named in said advertisement of sale,and then and there offered the real estate decreed to be sold at public auction,to the highest bidder,as provided by the decree,and receiving no adequate bids therefor,they then and there withdrew the property from sale.
