Certified Copy of Will of Alice C. Koontz.

I, Alice C. Koontz of Frederick, Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, being of sound and disposing mind, Memory and understanding do make this my last Will and testament, hereby revoking all other wills heretofore made by me, in manner and form following:-

After all my just debts and funeral expenses are paid I give and devise and bequeath all of my property and estate unto my mother, S. Matilda Harris, for and during her natural lifetime, and upon her death I direct and empower my Executor hereinafter named to sell and convey all my real and personal property, and out of the proceeds of such sales I give and bequeath as follows:-

To my sister Georgia Katherine Lipscomb the sum of five hundred Dollars.

To the Executor or Administrator of the estate of Dr. Francis Fenwick Smith, deceased, late of said County, the sum of Three Hundred and Fifty Dollars

To Mt. Olivet Cemetery Company, a body corporate, the sum of one hundred dollars for the purpose of keeping the lot in said Cemetery in which I am to be buried in proper order and repair, in perpetuity. To the "Vestery of All Saints' Parish in Frederick County", a body corporate, the sum of Five Hundred Dollars.

To James Gibbons, Roman Catholic Archbishop of Baltimore, a corporation sole, and his successors, to be paid by said corporation sole to the Pastor of St. John's Catholic Church of Frederick, Maryland, for the time being, the sum of five hundred dollars. This bequest is made out of regard for my mother S. Matilda Harris.

To John Martz (son of John^H Martz of Frederick) the watch and chain formerly owned by my husband and also the sum of Five Hundred Dollars upon the condition that he arrives at the age of twenty-one years; otherwise the bequests to him shall revert to my estate.

All the rest and residue of my property and estate. I give and bequeath unto "The Trustees of the Orphans' House and Episcopal Free School Society of All saint's Church, Fredericktown", a body corporate. And lastly I hereby appoint George W. Heinlein of Frederick Maryland, to be Executor of this my last will and testament. In testimony whereof I hereunto set my hand and seal this 27th day of May 1917 in the Nineteen Hundred and fourteen.
