The Additional Water rent will also come against these properties.

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TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:-

The petition of H. K. DeLauter, Solicitor representing Susan Matilda Harris, one of the respondents in the above cause, respectfully represents:

1. That in the above cause a creditors' bill was filed for the sale of the real estate of the late Alice Koontz, for the purpose of applying the proceeds of the sale of said real estate to the payment of the debts due by said Alice C. Koontz, and also to apply the rents and income arising from said estate to the payment of said debts.
2. That by the last will and testament of the said Alice Koontz, her estate was devised and bequeathed to the said Susan Matilda Harris for and during her natural life,
3. That the said life tenant, Susan Matilda Harris, retained the said H. K. DeLauter, to look after her interest in these proceedings, and his appearance was entered in this cause, and an answer of the said life tenant was filed by him, all of which will appear by reference to the proceedings in this cause.
4. That the Solicitor for the Complainant, in this cause, on August 8, 1916, without the consent or knowledge of your petitioner, submitted the proceedings in said cause to the court for decree, which was signed on same day by his Honor, Judge Worthington, directing amongst other things that said rents and incomes be applied to the payment of the debts of the said Alice Koontz, and that her real estate be sold, and appointing George W. Heinlein, Trustee to make said sale.
5. That under the custom and practice of this Court, your petitioner is entitled to be heard on the questions involved, especially regarding the rents and income, and is also entitled to representation in the trusteeship. Wherefore your petitioner prays your Honors to pass an order rescinding said order and decree dated August 8th, 1917, in this cause, and allowing your petitioner the right to be heard on the various issues raised in the proceedings in this cause.
