BILL OF COMPLAINT.

This complainant respectfully shows to the Court as follows:

1. That he is a citizen of the United States and a resident of the District of Columbia, and brings this suit in his own right as a creditor of the Morris Iron & Steel Company, and on behalf of such creditors of the defendant, Morris Iron & Steel Company, as may intervene herein.
2. The defendant, the Morris Iron & Steel Company, is a corporation duly organized and existing under the laws of the State of Maryland, having its principal place of business in the City of Frederick, Maryland, and is sued in its own right.
3. Your complainant further states to the Court that this Company was organized some time in the year 1911, and commenced the manufacture of iron and steel products, and for the purposes set out in an instrument hereinafter referred to, the defendant Company heretofore made and executed its deed of trust to the Fidelity Trust Company of Baltimore, Maryland, as trustee by which it conveyed all of its real estate, buildings, plant and equipment of every kind and description situate in the City of Frederick, Maryland; also all of its tools, implements and machinery in trust, however, to secure the bond issue made by the defendant Company in the sum of One Hundred and Ten Thousand Dollars (\$110,000) for the purposes set out in said trust, which was thereafter duly recorded among the Land Records of Frederick County in the State of Maryland, reference to which is hereby made as though the same was incorporated in full in this bill. Your complainant further states that but Sixty-one Thousand Dollars (\$61,000) of said bonds were sold; the remaining issue amounting to Forty-nine Thousand Dollars (\$49,000) having been used by the Company, however, as collateral security for the payment of the notes of the Company, said notes having been given for money borrowed for the purposes of conducting the business of the Company so that all of said bonds are now outstanding under the conditions heretofore stated.
