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TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT!:-

The petition of H.K. DeLauter, Trustee in the above cause, respectfully represents:

1. That an appraisement of all the property mentioned in the deed of Trust in the above cause, has been made and returns to your Court, by Roger M. Neighbors and Charles F. Seeger, who valued the real estate at \$4500.00 and the personal property at \$1272.00.
2. That the real estate consists of a house and lot land in the village of Brad-dock, in Frederick County, Maryland, and said house is now vacant; the personal property is a lot of machinery in the shop on said land, and a lot of lumber, being odds and ends, boards of different lengths; pieces of moulding, etc., in the shop and a lot of undressed lumber of various sizes and lengths on the outside of the shop, about ten tons of coal and some furniture, quantities of the lumber are lying on the outside of the building with no way of securing it from any one who may take the same away, while no one is living in the house.
