Eleventh! That your Petitioners herewith file their recommendation, that their sister Georgia E. Grove also known as G. Emma Grove, be appointed trustee in the place and stead of their father, Joshua A. Dill deceased, trustee.

WHEREFORE, Your petitioners pray for the following relief!

1. That a trustee may be appointed with all the power and authority necessary to carry out the decrees heretofore passed in this cause, to receive the monies in the hands of the said Joshua A. Dill, trustee, deceased, etc.;
2. And for such other and further relief as the nature of their case may require.

Upon the foregoing petition it is ORDERED this 2nd day of May 1917, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity, that Georgia Emma Grove, be and she is, hereby appointed trustee in the above entitled cause, in the place and stead of Joshua A. Dill, deceased, with power and authority to collect and receive all monies and funds in the hands of the said Joshua A. Dill, trustee, at the time of his death, and representing the proceeds of the several sales reported to and ratified by the Court in this case, which said monies the said Georgia Emma Grove, trustee is hereby authorized to collect and receive, and the officers of the bank or banks, in which said monies are so deposited are hereby directed and required to deliver to the said Georgia Emma Grove, trustee, all monies in said bank to the credit of the said Joshua A. Dill, trustee; and said Georgia Emma Grove, trustee, is hereby authorized and directed to make sale of the real estate unsold, said sales to be either public or private in her discretion, and at such time as she may seem advantageous, the proceeds of said sale to be brought into this Court to be disposed of under its direction, to the end that final settlement and distribution may be made herein among the parties entitled to the funds, according to their respective interests, the course and manner in making said sales to be the same as that prescribed in the several decrees heretofore passed in this case, conferring this power and authority upon said Joshua A. Dill, deceased; provided the said Georgia Emma Grove, files her bond for the faithful performance of her duties as trustee in the penalty of Twenty Thousand Dollars, with security to be approved by court or the clerk thereof.

TO THE HONORABLE JUDGES OF SAID COURT!-

The Petition of Georgia E. Grove, trustee in the above entitled cause respectfully shows!-

FIRST! That on May 2, 1917, she was appointed trustee in this cause, in the place and stead of Joshua A. Dill, deceased, and qualified by giving the required bond.

SECOND! That acting under the orders of your Honorable Court, passed May 2, 1917, she proceeded to reduce to her possession the monies which were in the hands of this trustee at the time of his death, and which she believed were deposited in the name of Joshua A. Dill, trustee.

THIRD! That upon investigation she finds that the sum of Thirty One Hundred and Sixty Two (\$3162.00) Dollars is deposited in the Farmers' & Mechanics National Bank bearing interest account No. B 1736, and that the sum of Six Hundred and Forty Eight (\$648.) Dollars is on deposit in the Citizens' National Bank, being interest account No. 1480 D, and that in addition there is also in deposit in the Citizens' National Bank Sixty Four Dollars and Sixty Two (\$64.62) Cents being balance of a checking account in said bank.
