Dill, there being no assets.

Wherefore, Your Petitioner prays that your Honorable Court will decide and decree that said monies herein mentioned are a part of the trust estate in this cause, and to that end pass an order requiring to said baks to appear and show cause, if any they have, why said monies should not be paid over to your petitioner.

And your petitioner prays for such further and other relief as the nature of her case may require
