Marion C. Marker, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the plaintiffs having first been duly sworn, deposes and says:- One of the Plaintiff's ..

My name is Marion C. Marker I am 32 years of age and I reside in Baltimore City, Md. I knew George W. Marker in his life time, he was my father and resident of Frederick County, Maryland. He is now dead having died intestate on the 14th day of July, 1917. and at the time of his death he was seized and possessed of certain tracts and parcels of land in Catoctin District, in Frederick County, Maryland. said tracts containing in the aggregate about 145 acres of land. I look at Exhibit Nos. 1, 2, 3 and 4 they are deeds for said land to the said George W. Marker for the same and I think they correctly describe the same. This land is worth about \$75.- or \$80. per acre- the farm the Mountain land \$3.00 at the time of his death the said George W. Marker left surviving him a widow, Elizabeth A. Marker who is aged 52 years and the following childr
