To the Honorable, the JUDGES of said Court -----

The Bill of Complaint of Adrian K. Neale of the City of Pittsburg in the State of Pennsylvania, who sues in his own behalf and in behalf of all others Creditors of Sophia T. Bell, late of Frederick County, Maryland, deceased, who will come in contribute to the expense of this suit--respectfully shows unto your Honors---

1. That Sophia T. Bell, late of Frederick County and State of Maryland departed this life intestate on or about the month of October, A.D. 1917, seized and possessed of a certain dwelling house and lot of ground situate, lying and being in the city of Frederick and State of Maryland as will appear by a certified copy of a deed for said dwelling house and lot of ground herewith filed and marked Exhibit No. 1 to the Bill--which Exhibit as well as all other Exhibits herewith filed it is prayed may be taken and considered as a part of this Bill of Complaint--except such part of said lot of ground as was sold in the lifetime of said Sophia T. Bell to William M. and George C. S. Bopst as will appear by Exhibit No. 2 filed herewith.

2. That the said Sophia T. Bell was at the time of her decease a Widow and left surviving her no children or the decendants of a deceased child and no surviving husband--but left as her next of kin to whom said dwelling house and lot decended--the
