

following Nieces and Nephews--an adult niece Annie M. Smith who is a widow! an adult niece Rosa N. Jackson whose husbands name is John I. Jackson the said Annie M. Smith and Rose N. Jackson being children of Joseph Neale a deceased brother of Sophia T. Bell and all are non-residents of this State residing in the District of Columbia. An adult Niece Josephine N. Knott who is a widow and residing in the City of Philadelphia and State of Pennsylvania! and adult niece Gertrude A. Neale who is unmarried! an adult nephew Harvey T. Neale whose wives name is Alice J. Neale! an adult nephew George A. Neale whose wives name is Fannie Neale and your Orator Adrian K. Neale who is unmarried and an adult niece Sarah N. Smith whose husbands name is Francis deS Smith the said Josephine, Gertrude, Harvey, George, Adrian and Sarah being the children of Samuel A. Neale a deceased brother of Sophia T. Bell and all of whom are non-residents of the State of Maryland residing in the City of Pittsburgh in the State of Pennsylvania--except the said Sarah and Francis who reside in the District of Columbia and the said Josephine who resides in Philadelphia as aforementioned.

3. That your Orator was during the lifetime and at the time of the decease of the said Sophia T. Bell a large creditor of the said Sophia T. Bell--to-wit. in the sum of \$954.92 for money loaned her at sundry times--and--the said sum is wholly due and unpaid. as will appear by Exhibit No. 2 1/2.
4. That the said Ella Kate Cramer is a Judgment creditor of the said Sophia T. Bell in the sum of \$200.00 as will appear by a certified copy of a Judgment herewith filed and marked Exhibit No 3 to the bill and your Orator avers that said judgment is prior lien on said dwelling house and lot of ground mentioned in Exhibit No. 1.
5. That the said Spphia T. Bell at the time of her death left personal property insufficient in amount to pay her debts and the costs of Administration.
6. That the funeral expenses of the said Spphia T. Bell are as yet in large part unpaid.

To the end Therefore

1st. That the said real estate of which the said Sophia T. Bell died seized and possessed may be sold by Decree of this Honorable Court by a Trustee to be named in said Decree and the proceeds arising from such sale may be brought into this honorable Court to be distributed under the direction and control of the Court--

1st. To the payment of all public dues and charges and the costs and expenses of this proceeding, including a reasonable counsel fee to the Solicitor filing the bill.

2nd. To the payment in full of said lien claim and such other debts as are by law preferred, then to the payment of the general creditors of the deceased and the surplus, if any there be, be paid to the persons entitled thereto. And for such other and further order and Decree as the case of your Orator in its nature may require.

May it please your Honors to grant unto your Orator the writ of Sub-poena in the usual form commanding the said Ella Kate Cramer to be and appear in your Honorable Court in person or by Solicitor on some day certain to be named therein to answer the premises and show cause if any she may have why a decree should not pass as prayed for.

And may it please your Honors to pass an Order of Publication giving notice to the said Annie Neale Smith--Rose N. Jackson and John I. Jackson her husband, Josephine N. Knott, Gertrude A. Neale Sara N. Smith and Francis deS Smith her husband, Harvey T. Neale and Alice J. Neale her husband, George A. Neale and Fannie Neale his wife the said non-resident Defendants of the object and purpose of the Bill of Complaint and warning them or either of them to be and appear in your honorable Court on some day certain to be named therein either in person or by Solicitor and show cause if any they or either of them may have why a decree should not pass as prayed for.

And as in duty, will ever pray etc.
