THIS INQUISITION, taken this 20th day of December, in the year nineteen hundred and Sixteen, in Frederick County, State of Maryland, before William C. Roderick, Esquire, the Sheriff of said County, by virtue of the annexed writ de lunatico inquirendo to him directed, issued out of said Circuit Court for Frederick County, upon the oaths and affirmations of Raymond Long, Adam Railing, Lawson Dubel, George W. Purdy, William Fout, William Darner, George M. Engle, John D. Williams, William V. Wolfe, William A. Miller Ezra D. Hoffman and Wm. B.
