

trust on her part, unless it be in writing and signed by her, it cannot be enforced in a Court of Equity, especially after this lapse of time. The demurrer must, therefore, be sustained. It is thereupon, this 25th day of March, A.D. 1918, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, and by the authority thereof, adjudged and ordered that the demurrer to the petition of George T. Lingg and others be and the same is hereby sustained, but leave is hereby granted to the said petitioners to amend their petition within ten days from the date of this order if they can, by so doing, comply with the views expressed above.
