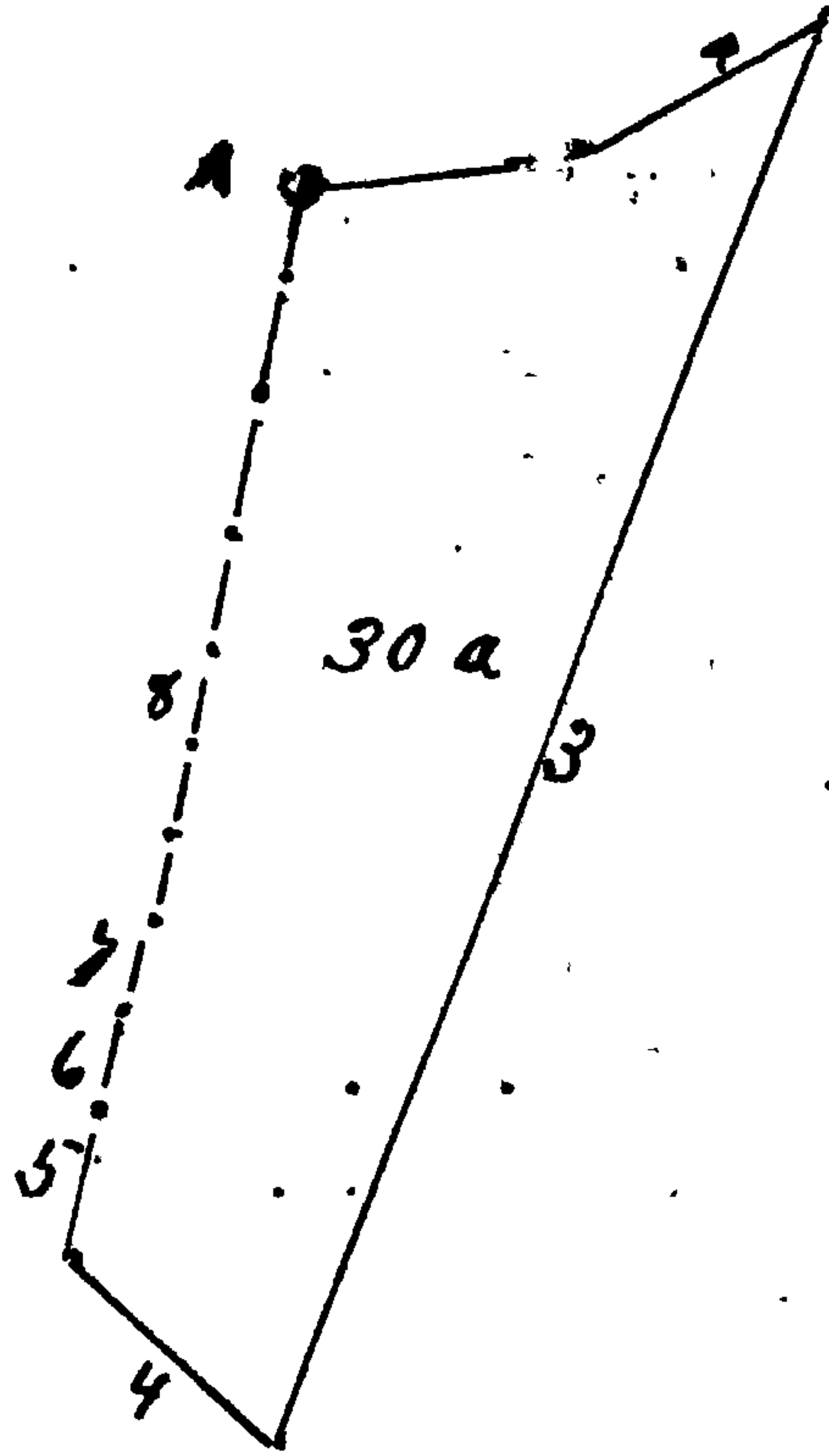


EXHIBIT NO 2.

Platt of Part of a Tract of land called the Principle,
Devised to Joseph Harris by his father Z.G.Harris

Beginning for said part at a forked Willow, standing on the north margin
of The Public Road at the end of 89 3/4 perches on the 5th line in a deed from R.P.
Jackson et al, to Z.G.Harris and running with the lines of said deed, correcting the
bearing four courses to wit:

(1) N.87 1/2 E.34 perches,(2) N.55 3/4 E 29 1/2 ps,(3) S.22 1/2 W.166 ps,(4)
N.55 W.24 3/100 ps to a point near a double maple tree,then(5)N.20° E 29 ps to a
least tree(6) N.15 1/2 E 16 ps to ditte,(7) N25° E 8 ps to a stone,now planted(8)
N.6°E79 1/2 ps,to the Beginning containing 30 acres and 9 perches of ground:
