

Alenze Harris, unmarried, now own said real estate as tenants in common, each being the owner of an undivided one fourth thereof. That said lands cannot be divided among said tenants in common without or injury to the parties interested.

That said James P. Harris obtained a judgment against said Alenze Harris in the Circuit Court for Frederick County on the 21st day of March 1914, for the sum one hundred and ten dollars with interest and costs and which said judgment is a lien upon the interest of said Alenze Harris in said real estate, and said James P. Harris is entitled to have his interest as lienor protected in the distribution of the proceeds of sale and paid out of the share of said Alenze Harris. The bill alleges that the plaintiffs, Ada M. Yates and Earl W. Yates her husband, are both residents of the District of Columbia, the plaintiffs Emma S. Williams and Harry Williams her husband, are both residents of Baltimore city, in the State of Maryland, and the plaintiffs Rachel Eleanor Harris and James P. Harris, her husband, are both residents of Frederick County, and the said Alenze Harris, the defendant is a non-resident of the State of Maryland, whose whereabouts are unknown to the plaintiffs, and when last heard from by them was a resident of the city of San Francisco, in the State of California.

The bill prays for a sale of said real estate by a decree of said Honorable Court and a division of the money arising from such sale among the parties entitled thereto according to their respective rights.

The bill also prays for an order of publication against said Alenze Harris, who is an adult and non-resident of the State of Maryland, and whose present whereabouts is unknown to the plaintiffs, but who when last heard from was a resident of the city of San Francisco, California, stating the substance and object of said Bill of Complaint and warning to be and appear in said Court on or before a certain day to be named in such order and show cause why the relief prayed should not be granted.

It is thereupon adjudged and ordered that the plaintiffs by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks before the 2nd day of November, A.D. 1918, give notice to the said non-resident defendant, Alenze Harris, of the object and substance of said bill, and warn him to appear in this court in person or by solicitor on or before the 18th day of November, A.D. 1918, and show cause why the relief prayed should not be granted.
