The Bill of Complaint of Margaret M. Molesworth, Florida Davis, Harry L. Davis her husband, Minnie Andrews, (formerly Minnie Molesworth) Mary T. Molesworth and Roger W. Molesworth, respectfully shews unto your Honors;

Ist. THAT John W. Molesworth late of Frederick County, Maryland, deceased, by the Provisions of his last Will and Testament, bearing date on the 19 day of November, 1906, duly probated, admitted to record and recorded in Liber W:B:C:No.2. Folio 550, one of the Land Record Books for Wills in the Office of the Register of Wills of Frederick County, did among other things provide as follows;

"After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses, I, give, devise and bequeath all of my property of every kind and description, real Personal or mixed to my beloved wife, Maggie M. Molesworth, for and during her natural life, as long as she shall remain my widow, and at her death I desire all lot my prperty shall be sold and the proceeds thereof divided; into six equal parts or portions, one of which said shares or portions I give to my daughter Florida Davis, the wife of Harry L. Davis one of which shares I give to my daughter Margaret Earle Cecil the wife of Morgan Cecil, One of which shares I give to my daughter Minnie Molesworth, one of which shares I give to my daughter Mary T. Molesworth, one of which shares I give to my son John W. Molesworth, Jr., one of which I give to my son Roger W. Molesworth, .

But in the event of the remarriage of my said wife, Maggie M. Molesworth, I desire that all my Property shall be sold and divided into seven equal shares or portions, one of which said shares or Parts, I give to my wife Maggie M. Molesworth, one of said shares I give to the said Florida Davis, one of which shares I give to my daughter Margaret Earle Cecil, one of which said shares I give to my daughter Minnie Molesworth, one of said shares I give to my daughter Mary T. Molesworth, one of which said shares I give to my Son John W. Molesworth, Jr., and one of said shares I give to my son Roger W. Molesworth.
