

Exhibits, herewith filed, it is Prayed may be taken and considered as a Part of this Bill of Complaint,

2nd. That since the death of the said John W. Molesworth, and the probate of his said last will and testament, his said daughter, Margaret Earle Cecil, has departed this life intestate, leaving her surviving husband, Morgan Cecil and two infant children namely Margaret Earle Cecil and John Cecil.

3rd. That there never have been any administration of the estate, of the said Margaret Earle Cecil, and no Administrator of her estate has ever been appointed.

4th. That since the death of the said John W. Molesworth, and the Probate of his last will and testament his said son John W. Molesworth, Jr., has departed this life intestate, leaving him surviving his widow Edith H. Molesworth, and five infant children, namely, Joice Molesworth, Minnie Earle Molesworth, John William Molesworth, Richard Molesworth, and Beverly Molesworth,

5th. That administration of the estate of the said John W. Molesworth, Jr., was on the 19th day of December, 1918, granted by the Orphans Court, of Frederick County, to said Edith H. Molesworth, as administratrix, who has duly qualified and entered upon the discharge of her duties, as such administratrix, as will fully appear by reference to a certified Copy of letters of administration herewith filed as Exhibit "B",

6th. That the above named complainant, Margaret M. Molesworth, is the widow of the said John W. Molesworth, deceased, referred to and described in his said last will as Maggie M. Molesworth, and she and the said Florida Davis, Harry L. Davis, her husband, Mary T. Molesworth, and Roger W. Molesworth, are all adults, residents of Frederick County, Maryland; that said complainant, Minnie Andrews, is a daughter of said John W. Molesworth, deceased, and is mentioned and referred to in his said last will as his daughter Minnie Molesworth; that she subsequently intermarried, with one Harry Andrews, who is now deceased, the said Minnie Andrews, being an adult resident of Baltimore City, State of Maryland,

7th. That the said Edith Molesworth, administratrix, of John W. Molesworth, Jr., deceased is an adult resident of Frederick County, State of Maryland, and residing with her in said Frederick County, are the infant children of herself and the said John W. Molesworth, Jr., deceased, namely Joice Molesworth, Minnie Earle Molesworth, John William Molesworth, Richard Molesworth, and Beverly Molesworth, That Morgan Cecil, the surviving husband of Margaret Earle Cecil is an adult resident of the State of Pennsylvania, and Margaret Earle Cecil and John Cecil, the infant children of said Morgan Cecil and his deceased wife, Margaret Earle Cecil, are residents of Frederick County, State of Maryland, That the Central Trust Company of Maryland, is a body Corporate, of the State of Maryland, with its principal Office in Frederick, Maryland, and Charles A. Collins, surviving partner of Collins & Grossnickle, is an adult resident of Frederick County, State of Maryland,

8th. That the Central Trust Company of Maryland on the 26th day of April, 1918 obtained in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, a confessed judgment, against said John W. Molesworth, Jr., Edith H. Molesworth and Margaret M. Molesworth, for the sum of Eight Hundred and Thirty Dollars and Eighty Eight Cents, (\$830.88) with interest from date, costs of suit, etc., as will appear by reference to a certified Copy of said judgment herewith filed, as "Exhibit" C, That the said Charles A. Collins, surviving partner of Collins and Grossnickle, on the 4th day of February, 1919, obtained a Magistrates judgment as recorded in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, on the 3rd day of April, 1919) against the said Margaret M. Molesworth, and Edith H. Molesworth, for the sum of Twenty-Seven Dollars, and Sixty Cents, (\$27.60) with interest and costs, as will fully appear by reference to a certified Copy of said Judgment herewith filed, as "Exhibit" D.

9th. That among other property devised under the above mentioned provisions of the last will and Testament of John W. Molesworth, deceased, unto the said Margaret M. Molesworth for life, or widowhood, was the farm known as the "Warfield Farm," situate and lying in Frederick County, State of Maryland, on the west side of and adjacent to the road leading from Urbana in Frederick county, to Hyattstown, in Montgomery County, (formerly known as the Georgetown Pike) containing Two Hundred and Seven and Three-fourths (207 $\frac{3}{4}$) acres of land more or less. It being the Real Estate heretofore conveyed, unto the said John W. Molesworth, by Luther D. Warfield, et al., Trustees, by deed bearing date, on the 18th day of February, 1903, and recorded in Liber D.H.H.NO. 15 folio 64I one of the Land Records of Frederick County, a certified Copy of which is herewith filed as "Exhibit"
