Meleswerth, Jr., deceased, the infants, Joice Meleswerth, Minnie Earle Meleswerth, John William Meleswerth, Richard Meleswerth, and Beverly Meleswerth, children of John W. Meleswerth, Jr., deceased, the infants Margaret Earle Cecil and John Cecil, Children of Margaret Earle Cecil, deceased, THE Central Trust Company of Maryland, a body corporate and Charles A. Collins, residents of Frederick County, State of Maryland, commanding them and each of them to be and appear in this Court on some certain day to be therein named to answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein,

And may it please your Honors to grant unto your complainants an order of publication giving notice to the said Morgan Cecil who is a non resident as before stated, of the substance and object of this Bill, and warning him to appear in this Court in person or by Solicitor, on or before a certain day to answer the premises and shew cause, if any he has, why a decree should not pass as prayed, and as in duty bound,

Certified Copy of Will.

I, John W. Meleswerth, of Frederick County and the State of Maryland, do hereby make, ordain, publish and declare this as and for my last will and testament,

After the payment of my just debts and funeral expenses, I give, devise and bequeath all of my property of every kind and description, real, personal or mixed to my beloved wife Maggie M. Meleswerth, for and during her natural life, as long as shall my widow, and at her death I desire that all of my property shall be sold and the proceeds thereof divided into Six equal shares or portions, One of which said shares or portions I give to my daughter Florida David, wife of Harry L. Davis, One of which shares I give to my daughter Margaret Earle Cecil, the wife of Morgan Cecil, One of which shares I give to my daughter Minnie Meleswerth, One of which shares I give to my daughter Mary T. Meleswerth, One of which shares I give to my son John W. Meleswerth, Jr., One of which shares I give to my son Reger W. Meleswerth,

But in the event of the remarriage of my said wife, Maggie M. Meleswerth, I desire that all of my property shall be sold and divided into Seven equal shares or portions, One of which said shares or parts, I give to my said wife, Wife Maggie M. Meleswerth, one of Said Shares, I give to the said Florida Davis, One of which said Shares I give to my daughter Margaret Earle Cecil, One of which Said Shares I give to my daughter Minnie Meleswerth, One of Said Shares I give to my daughter Mary T. Meleswerth, one of Said shares, I give to my Son John W. Meleswerth, Jr., one of Said Shares I give to my Son Reger W. Meleswerth,

In the event that Any of my Said children Should contest the provisions of this my will, I direct that he, She or they, so contesting, shall forfeit all right, and interest in my estate absolutely.

If any of my said Children are indebted to me or my estate at the time of my
