George M. Gittinger, A, witness of lawful age produced on the part of the Complainants, being first duly sworn and examined viva voce, deposes and says as follows;-

My name is George M. Gittinger, I am fifty nine years of age, and reside in Frederick City, Maryland, and at Braddock Heights, Frederick County, Maryland.

I know the parties to this suit and I knew John W, L. Poole (generally known as John Poole) during his lifetime, and knew that he left surviving him a widow and two children, a son and one daughter, whom I have known from their Birth, as far as I know he died intestate.

During his life-time and at the time of his death he was seized and possessed of several pieces of property, one lying near Mt. Philip School House. in Frederick County, Maryland, and the other being a tract of Mountain land,

I look at Exhibits A- B--. which are handed to me, they are certified copies of the deeds by which the said John W, L. Poole acquired the property mentioned in these proceedings, and they correctly describe the said property.

I look at Exhibit C. which is also an Acknowledgement of purchase of the property, described in these proceedings subject to the approval of the Court, under this agreement Mr, Harry M. Feaga, proposes to pay \$1537, 50, for the property located near Mt, Philip, School House, and \$417, 37, for the Mountain lot. which parcels of land are described in Exhibit A, and B.

I am familiar with the value of the property, in this vicinity, and I believe that the prices offered are fair and Equitable, and that it would be to the benefit and advantage of the parties to this suit and particularly the infant defendants, that said proposed sale, be ratified and confirmed, by the Court, and the proceeds distributed among the parties legally entitled to receive the same.
