That on the date April 25th, 1911, your Oratrix at the request of the Defendant, Sadie E Mehrling, paid unto John S. Newman and Millard F. Shafer receivers aforesaid, the said sum of \$9150,00 and said receivers endorsed said Single Bills, without recourse unto them and delivered Said Ten Single Bills, unto your Oratrix who now holds the same as the owner thereof.

That all of said single Bills remain due and payable unto your Oratrix, with interest, thereon from the date April 25th, 1911,

That Your Oratrix is advised and therefore alleges and Charges, that the said Harry L, Mehrling died possessed of no personal estate, of any Character, out of which the sums of money due unto your Oratrix and the claim of any other creditor of said deceased, if such there be, of the said deceased, can be paid and Satisfied, and that no letters, of administration upon his personal estate, have been granted, by the Orphan Court, for Frederick county, Maryland.

That your Oratrix files this her Bill of Complaint not only on her own behalf, but also on behalf of any other creditors, of the said Harry L, Mehrling, if such there be, who will come into, your Honorable Court, and contribute to the expenses proper and incidental to this her Bill, of Complaint.

Wherefore your Oratrix prays for the following relief,

That your Honors will pass the Order or decree of your Honorable Court, that the real estate, of which the said Harry L, Mehrling deceased, died seized and possessed, and as set forth in paragraph four, of this her said Bill, of complaint, or so much thereof as may be necessary, may be sold, by a suitable person as Trustee, to be named in said decree, for the purpose of paying the said sums of money due unto your Oratrix, and any other creditors, of said, Harry L, Mehrling, if such there be,

And for such other and further relief to which your Oratrix may be entitled, and as to your honors will appear, to be just and suitable, in the premises,

Mat it please your Honors to grant unto your Oratrix, the writ of subpeens, directed to said Defendants, Sadie E, Mehrling, widow, and Nellie Louise Mehrling, infant residents of Frederick County, Maryland, commanding them and each of them to be and appear in person or by Solicitor in Your Honorable Court, on a certain day to be named therein to answer the Bill of Complaint. and to abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein,

This Deed made this Second day of August, in the year eighteen hundred and ninety five, by us, Susan A, Wenner, and William W, Wenner her husband of Loudon County, State of Virginia, Witnesseth;- that in consideration of the sum of one hundred and Twenty five Dollars, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, we the said Susan A, Wenner, and William W, wenner, do grant in fee simple unto Harry L. Mehrling of Brunswick, County of Frederick and State of Maryland, the following described lot or parcel of land, in Brunswick, aforesaid, it being known
