In pursuance given me by the Solicitor, in the above entitled cause, I, Clayton O, Keedy on of the standing Examiners, of said Court, duly appointed, qualified and sworn, having assigned the 22nd day of April A,D,1920, at my office in Frederick, Maryland, as the time and place for Taking testimony, in this cause, and having given due notice thereof to the parties concerned did at the appointed time, and place proceed to take the following testimony, to wit:-

The Plaintiff filed with the Examiner, as evidence Exhibits A,B,C, which are herewith returned by the said Examiner,

Henry M, Gittinger, a Witness of Lawful age, produced on the part of the plaintiff being duly Sworn, and examined viva voce deposes and says, as follows:-

My name is Henry M, Gittinger, my age 66 years i reside on North Market Street, in Fred erick, at No. 405- about opposite to the Rice property, mentioned herein I Know the parties to thi suit, I know the properties described in the Bill in this case, consisting of lot 24½ feet front on North Market Street and an additional lot 24½ feet by 98 feet, and a nine foot inlet, or alley, running from the North side of east fourth street, to the first above mentioned lot.

The decedent, mentioned in these proceedings David S, Rice was he owner of an Undived one interest in the lots of Ground hereinbefore mentioned hñs Brother Thomas P. Rice, and his Sister
