To The Honorable, the Judges of said Court;-

Your Orators complaining, say.

1- That Edward M, Halley, late of Frederick County, Maryland, died intestate, in the year 1907, seized and possessed of a lot of or parcel of ground, Situated on the East side of South Market Street in Frederick City, Frederick County, Maryland, which is improved by Two Three story Brick Dwelling Houses, now known as 108-and 110, South Market Street, being the same land, and premises which were conveyed to him by Sarah J, Cecil and others, by deed dated October 25, 1902, and duly recorded among the land records of Frederick County, a certified copy of which deed is herewith filed, as part hereof, Marked Exhibit A,.

2- That at the time of his death. the said Edward M, Halley left surviving him, a widow, Maude M, Halley, an adult now residing in Washington City, in the District of Columbia, and the following six children, as his only heirs at law, Viz;- A daughter Louise M, who has since intermarried, with, Creston C, Shelley, both of whom are adults, residing in Baltimore City, Maryland,

2- A Daughter, A, Elizabeth, who has intermarried with Albert E, Depro both of whom are adults, residing in Baltimore City, Maryland,

3- A daughter Nan Castle Halley,

4- A Son David A, Halley,

5 A son Frank M, Halley, all of whom are infants under twenty one years of age, residing in Washington City, in the District of Columbia, and

6- A son Edward Halley. Jr, he is an infant under the age of twenty one years, residing in Baltimore City, Maryland to which Children the said real estate, descended as tenants in common. subject to the dower right of said widow, Maude M, Halley, and who now hold the same as such,
